- An honorably discharging, reserve or veteran Marine who is planning to attend a college/university as a freshman or transfer student?
- Do you have an AFQT score of 70 or above and a GT score of 115 or above?

A High School Graduate? Waivers for those not meeting these requirements may be granted on occasion.

WHAT TO DO

- Call or Email the LSP to determine eligibility or needs.
- Check out the list of participating colleges/universities.
- Make sure you meet the institution's criteria.
- Make sure the institution of your choice offers the major area of study you are interested in pursuing.
- Fill out the online application and gather your submission materials.

WHAT TO SUBMIT

With most applications you will be asked to submit the following:

- One copy of High School transcripts (Unofficial).
- One copy of College transcripts (Unofficial).
- One copy of Sailor/Marine American Council on Education Registry Transcript (SMART)
- One copy of NAVMC 118 (3); (11); and (12).
- One copy of ROS, BIR, BTR, AWARDS PAGE, AND EDUCATION RECORD (TEDU).
- Letter of Recommendation from or phone/email of your commanding officer or any officer for whom you have worked.
