MARINE CORPS COMMUNITY SERVICES ORDER 1746.1D

Subj: CONTROL AND SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Ref: (a) ASO 1746.2A w/Ch1
(b) Dram Shop Act

1. Purpose. To publish regulations concerning the control and sale of alcoholic beverages at MCCS activities.

2. Cancellation. MCCSO 1746.1C

3. General. Reference (a) sets forth regulations concerning the use and sale of alcoholic beverages. The following regulations will govern the control and sale of alcoholic beverages within MCCS activities. This order does not supersede nor replace station, or state or federal regulations, which will be complied with at all times.

a. Sale of Distilled Spirits. Sale of distilled spirits is not authorized for an Exchange Activity unless specifically approved by higher headquarters. The sale of distilled spirits is authorized for designated Food and Business activities, and the Package Store.

b. On Premise Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages

(1) The on-premise sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized at the following activities:

- (a) The Shame
- (b) Miller's Landing and environs
- (c) Roadhouse and Roadhouse Bar
- (d) Bowling Center Snack Bar

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- (e) Golf Course
- (f) Two Rivers Theater & Event Center

(2) All activities will post age regulations and provide Designated Driver Programs

c. Off Premise Sale of Alcoholic Beverages

(1) Off-premise sales of alcoholic beverages is authorized at the following activities:

- (a) Package Store
- (b) Marine Mart
- (c) Troop Store
- (d) Convenience Store
- (e) Bogue Field Convenience Store

(2) Sales will be conducted only during normal operating hours except club catered services. Club catered off-premises sales will be limited to catered events.

(3) All activities selling alcoholic beverages by case lots must have a sign posted that informs patrons that they become subject to the laws of North Carolina when transporting alcoholic beverages off military reservations. All activities will post drinking age regulations.

d. Instructions Concerning the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages by MCCS Activities.

(1) The references provide additional instructions for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

(a) Reference (b) is the statutory Dram Shop Act. Under the Dram Shop Act, civil and criminal liability may be incurred by the federal government and its agents who work in

MCCS clubs, activities and at official and quasi-official functions, for selling or furnishing alcoholic beverages to a minor or obviously intoxicated person. If that minor or person is subsequently involved in an accident, the federal government and its agents may be liable for the resultant damage.

(2) The sale of alcoholic beverages to a person under 21 years of age is prohibited.

(a) Officers and SNCO's in proper uniform will not be required to show their ID card to purchase alcohol.

(b) All other personnel will present their ID card to show proof of age.

(3) Failure on your part to reasonably protect MCCS from possible liable action under reference (b) could result in disciplinary action.

(4) Selling of alcoholic beverages to anyone under age or showing signs of intoxication could result in the employee being held personally liable in case of incident, accident, etc.

(a) Employees will refuse to sell any alcoholic beverage to anyone appearing to be intoxicated.

(b) Refer all such cases to the manager or duty manager.

(5) Managers or duty managers will terminate sale of alcoholic beverages to individuals where such action is considered to be in the best interest of the individual. Reasonable discretion will be used in exercising this authority.

4. Action.

a. Managers of activities listed in 3b and 3c above will provide semiannual training, encompassing, State and Federal regulations, plus identification of intoxicated persons and procedures for dealing with them. Managers will further ensure that all employees involved in the selling of alcoholic beverages be required to read the information stated in this Order.

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b. Each employee shall sign and date a copy of this Order, indicating that they have read and understand the contents. This signed copy is to be forwarded to the employee's personnel file.
